With Census Day (April 1, 2010) less than six months away, the US Census Bureau and various LGBT organizations will come together for a discussion on the counting of same-sex marriages; and the tabulating and reporting of the 2010 Census data on gay and lesbian households.

CENSUS DATA ARE USED:

- to apportion congressional seats to states;
- to distribute more than \$400 billion in federal funds to local, state and tribal governments each year; and
- to make decisions about what community services to provide.

The 2010 Census questionnaire will be one of the shortest ever. There are only ten questions, requiring about ten minutes to complete.
